ADA'S COACH LORANGER HIGH'S DEBATE TEAM

Amite- At this year's Baton Rouge Bar Association's Mock Trial Competition, Tangipahoa Parish was represented by the Loranger High School trial and debate team.

Over the past month, attorneys from District Attorney Scott M. Perrilloux's office have been going to the high school twice per week to help students from the team prepare for the competition. Assistant District Attorneys Le'Anne Malnar and Patricia Parker have worked to educate the students on the court system and trial practices.

Parker and Malnar taught the team how to lay the foundation of a trial, perform opening and closing statements, and other valuable trial techniques such as courtroom decorum and objections.

Although the two teams did not place, Malnar stated that the teams did an exceptional job at presentation exemplifying their understanding of the court system.

The Loranger High School trial and debate team is the only mock trial team in the Tangipahoa Parish School System, said Malnar. They competed in the Mock Trial Competition February 26, 2016, in Baton Rouge.

SHERIDAN SENTENCED TO NINE YEARS

Amite- Quinton Sheridan, age 38, of Ponchatoula, LA, pleaded no contest to unlawful use or access of social media and unlawful contact of a sex offender.

On March 24, 2015 agents advised they had placed Sheridan in custody after finding recent violations on a recent probation compliance visit at Sheridan's residence.

Sheridan was on probation and was required to register as a sex offender when he was convicted for indecent behavior with juveniles back in 2010

Agents advised while conducting a visit at Sheridan's residence the agent noticed Sheridan coming out of a shed near the home. Further inspection of the residence revealed photos of Sheridan's victim posted on the walls. Agents also located a phone a phone that showed he was active on social media sites and had made contact with the victim through social media accounts.

Sheridan is sentenced to nine years with the department of corrections. He is to serve his sentence without the benefit of probation, parole, or suspension of sentence.

Assistant District Attorney Britain Sledge represented the state with Judge Douglas Hughes presiding.

NOTABLE PLEAS:

Ronnie Brown, age 27, of Kentwood, LA, pleaded no contest to burglary of an inhabited dwelling and attempted simple escape. He was sentenced to 10 years with the department of corrections. He received credit for time served

Derek Jackson, age 20, of Hammond, LA, pleaded no contest to first degree robbery. He was sentenced to eight years with the department of corrections

Dean Sauerwin Jr., age 26, of Amite, LA, pleaded no contest to indecent behavior with a juvenile. He was sentenced to eight years with the department of corrections. Two years of the sentence are to be served without benefit.
