Tangipahoa Indictments

Amite- On December 5, 2014, the Tangipahoa Parish Grand Jury indicted the following defendants:

Grant Caruth: 25-year-old Grant Carruth, of 57460 Hwy 445, Husser, LA, was indicted with two counts of second degree kidnapping, one count of armed robbery, one count of aggravated rape, and one count of sexual battery.

The defendant was arrested on September 30, 2014, by officers from the Tangipahoa Parish Sheriff's Office. Assistant District Attorney Britain Sledge is prosecuting the case, said Perrilloux.

Jarvis J. Griffin: Griffin, age 23, of 173 Lamarca Lane, Independence, LA, was indicted with one count of aggravated battery. Griffin was arrested by officers from the Hammond Police Department on May 22, 2014. The case is being prosecuted by Assistant District Attorney Le'Anne Malnar.

Floyd Williams: Williams, age 21, of 43370 Klien Road, Hammond LA, was indicted with two counts of aggravated rape. He was arrested on August 6, 2014, by officers from the Tangipahoa Parish Sheriff's Office. The case is being prosecuted by Assistant District Attorney Don Wall.

Christopher N. Eason: Eason, age 26, of 15430 Quick Blvd., Hammond, LA, was indicted with

one count of second degree murder. Assistant District Attorney Don Wall is prosecuting the case.

Notable Convictions

Livingston- Glenn Dufrene, Jr., age 36, of LaPlace, LA, pleaded no contest to simple burglary. He was sentenced to serve eight years with the department of corrections.

Amite- Chrysheena McGee, age 38, of Springfield, LA, pleaded no contest to theft of the assets of an aged person or disabled person, and identity theft. She was sentenced to serve six years with the department of corrections for the first offense, and five years for the second. All time is to be served concurrently.

Amite- Billy Paddio, age 37, of Hammond, LA, pleaded no contest to possession with intent to distribute schedule II controlled dangerous substances. He was sentenced to serve eight years with the department of corrections.
