Parker Sentenced for Burglaries

Amite- 39-year-old Greg Parker, of Aleata Drive, Hammond, LA, was sentenced to serve a total of 10 years with the department of corrections after pleading no contest to simple burglary of an inhabited dwelling, unauthorized entry of an inhabited dwelling, and three counts of simple burglary on June 9, 2014, reports District Attorney Scott M. Perrilloux.

He was sentenced to serve two years with the department for each count of each offense. All time is to be served consecutively for a total of 10 years.

On May 4, 2013, officers from the Hammond Police Department were notified of a burglary at a home on Center Avenue in Hammond, LA. The victim stated that he awoke to find the defendant standing over him. Parker then held him down, pulled the wallet from the complainant's pocket, took all of the money from within, and fled the scene.

The victim identified Parker and a warrant was issued for his arrest. Then, on May 17, 2013, Parker committed a vehicular burglary and was once again identified by the victim. He was located and arrested on May 24, 2013, for both offenses.

Prior to the May 2013 arrests, Parker had been arrested for unauthorized entry of an inhabited dwelling on October 26, 2011, and two additional vehicular burglaries which took place on August 10, and September 10, 2012.

Parker was scheduled to begin trial on June 9, 2014, when he chose to enter the no contest plea.

Malnar Speaks on DUI

Hammond- On June 27, 2014, Assistant District Attorney Le'Anne Malnar spoke on the KSLU radio Program "Point of View" about driving while intoxicated. Malnar urged listeners to be careful during the 4th of July holiday, especially where it concerns driver safety. She asked listeners to be sure to prepare for July 4 celebrations by ensuring there will be a designated driver if people intend to drink. She also reviewed non-refusal check points, and discussed the dangers of texting and driving.



Notable Convictions

Amite- Romer Schmitt, age 29, of Amite, LA, was sentenced to serve 10 years with the department of corrections for production and manufacture of schedule II controlled dangerous substances .

Livingston- Jerry L. Miller, age 44, of Walker, LA, pleaded no contest to creation/operation of a clandestine laboratory. He was sentenced to serve five years with the department of corrections.

Amite- Jerome Rogers, age 31, of Hammond, LA, was sentenced to serve eight years with the department of corrections for distribution of schedule II controlled dangerous substances.

Livingston- Erick R. Morton, age 33, of Denham Springs, LA, pleaded guilty to three counts of simple burglary. He was sentenced to serve five years with the department of corrections for each count, to be served concurrently. He must also pay restitution.
